- ICC and e-UCP Version 2.0 - ICC

The International Chamber of Commerce on 1 July 2019 issued new electronic rules (e-Rules) as electronic supplements to the existing Uniform Rules for Collections (URC 522) and Uniform Customs and Practice for Documentary Credits (UCP 600) rules

The e-Rules extend the mitigation of risk from a paper environment to the electronic milieu (mixed ecosystem of paper and digital) and safeguards the applicability of ICC rules whilst guaranteeing relevance in a digital trade world.
